Letter from Board Chairman and Executive Director

This has been another fantastic year for The Reserve at Lake Keowee Foundation. In 2022, we reached a new record in charitable giving and donations. More than ever, thanks to all of you, we are fulfilling our mission of enhancing the quality of life and sense of community through environmental stewardship, educational opportunities, arts and cultural events, and charitable outreach.

We are especially proud of several significant accomplishments this year:

- We distributed a record amount in grants to 17 local charities a total of \$304,000, bringing our all-time total to \$1.7 Million!
- Through our Education Scholarship program we were able to provide a total of \$20,000 to 9 deserving students to help assist them financially as they pursue secondary education.
- With help from over 71 volunteers, we picked up 110 bags of trash along Hwy 133 as part of the Adopt-A-Highway program and as part of the semiannual FOLKS Lake Sweep clean-up. We are helping to do our part in keeping the trash off the roadside and out of local streams, which helps keep Lake Keowee clean and pristine.
- By hosting two Blood Drives on-site this year our member donors helped to save over 120 lives! Way to Go!
- We were able to hire an additional employee for the Foundation. Sarah Shockley is our Assistant Director for the Foundation. She works part-time assisting with the important work of our Foundation. We are so glad to have her on our team!

This impact we are making would not be possible without the numerous volunteers and donors that support our mission. Reserve members are so generous with their time and money, helping us to improve the lives of thousands of seniors, children, veterans and people in need in our local community. There are many opportunities to get involved by volunteering within the Foundation and with the non-profit organizations we help to support. We have a great number of members helping deliver meals to seniors and many helping make homes for veterans safe and accessible. These are just two examples of the great work and volunteerism that are helping to make a difference in our local community. Looking ahead to 2023, we are excited to continue improving our programing and expanding our impact in the local community and are happy to announce and welcome our new Board Chairman, Diane Mohr.





Charitable Outreach

Outreach is a very important part of our Foundation's mission. Each year the Foundation holds several fundraising events to raise money for local charities. From our Swine & Dine event, to the Charity Golf Classic, the Winding Roads book sales, the ART Shop sale and individual and corporate contributions we were able to donate \$304,000 to 17 local charities. This is a record amount which helps make a huge impact for so many in need in our local community. The Foundation has four committees comprised of Reserve members that assist with charitable operations, including the grant and scholarship review process and fundraising: Our Charity Review Committee reviews grant applications from charities to determine their relevance to the Foundation mission, service impact within our surrounding area, financial stability, and ongoing viability. Our Golf Classic Committee works all year to attract sponsors, volunteers and plan all aspects of the Charity Golf Classic. 2022 was the 14th consecutive year for this highly successful event that raised over \$140,000. The **ART Shop Committee** was formed in 2019 to encourage our very talented Reserve artists to donate their artwork so the Foundation can sell the items with all proceeds going to charity. The **Education Scholarship Committee** specifically works and reviews the applications for scholarships. This opportunity is made available to Reserve employees and their immediate family deserving students.








Donor Appreciation event

CANCER ASSOCIATION OF PICKENS COUNTY

We create new hope and improve the quality of life for local cancer patients and their families. We provide free of charge programs, services, education, assistance and support to meet the changing medical, financial, emotional, and educational needs of cancer patients and their families in Pickens County. We are a stand-alone organization, not affiliated with the American Cancer Society or any other cancer entity.

CAMP iRock (UNITED WAY PICKENS COUNTY)

A partnership between Pickens Co. United Way, school district and YMCA. Camp iRock is an innovative and award-winning summer camp that helps children improve their reading abilities while having tons of summer camp fun.

CENTER FOR DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES

A special place where Upstate SC families can find multiple community services in one location for children and individuals with developmental delays and disabilities.

FAMILY PROMISE

Helps low-income families achieve lasting independence. Enabling churches and volunteers to help those who need it most.

FEED A HUNGRY CHILD

Provides nutritional meals for children over the weekend throughout the school year who would otherwise go hungry.

GirlUp GVL

GirlUp GVL is a life enrichment program devoted to initiating early, life-changing success by empowering middle and high school girls of color to reach their highest potential. We do this through our pillars of enrichment, experience, and empowerment, which are all intended to help the girls develop a sense of their self in the context of the safe community built within our organization.

HAPPY HOOVES THERAPEUTIC EQUESTRIAN CENTER

Help to enhance the lives of special needs children and at-risk youth in the Upstate of South Carolina through equine assisted activities and therapies. Happy Hooves serves Pickens, Oconee, Anderson and Greenville counties. They serve children and adults with physical, psychological, emotional, behavioral, and social special needs, as well as at-risk youth.

HELPING HANDS OF CLEMSON

We provide the children placed in our care with a safe place to live as well as food, clothing, access to an education, healthcare, and counseling. The group home accepts abused and/or neglected children who have been taken into care by the SC Department of Social Services.

PATHWAYS (UNITED WAY PICKENS COUNTY)

A long term, one-on-one, intensive financial coaching program for people who need help managing money and achieving financial freedom.

PICKENS COUNTY ADVOCACY CENTER

Provides quality assistance and crisis intervention for all sexual assault victims in Pickens County. Provides 24-hour response for counseling, medical, court, law enforcement escort, educational programs, information and referral, legal advocacy and support services.

PICKENS COUNTY MEALS ON WHEELS

Combats effects of hunger, loneliness and isolation and provides a lifeline through the use of caring volunteers. Enrollment available to those 60 years of age or older.

PURPLE HEART HOMES (Golden Corner Chapter)

Their mission is to improve veteran's homes, one home at a time. Veterans who have received a Purple Heart award (wounded or injured in combat), those with service related disabilities, and aging in place needs.

Rebuild Upstate

Rebuild Upstate exists to repair the homes of our low-income neighbors to make homes safer, healthier, and more livable. We envision an Upstate where everyone has the opportunity to live a life of dignity in a safe home environment in order to maintain and foster strong, sustainable communities.

RIPPLE OF ONE

Empowers families to move beyond government assistance and into their full God-given potential...transforming generational poverty into generational progress one family at a time.

SAFE HARBOR

Provides shelter, counseling and advocacy for domestic violence victims and their children, as well as prevention/education throughout our community.

SAMARITAN HEALTH CLINIC

Provides medical, dental care and health education to those not eligible for Medicaid, Medicare or private health insurance with limited income.

SENIOR CENTER OF PICKENS

This is an all volunteer organization which is the centerpiece of the lives of senior citizens in Pickens County providing communal meals, entertainment, education, games and fitness classes. Their mission is to provide a safe and comfortable environment for seniors and other guests to come together every weekday.
