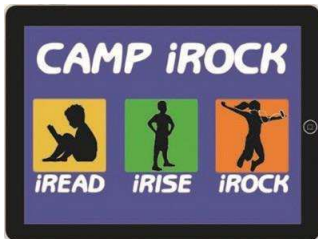


BRIEF PROGRAM AT TAMASSEE DAR

OCONEE COUNTY HUMANE SOCIETY

Both the Oconee County Sheriff's Department Animal Control Unit and the Oconee Humane Society are based at the Oconee Animal Shelter. Animal Control has the responsibility for overseeing the operations at the shelter, including vaccinating and caring for the animals. They respond to animal issues and complaints in the community. The Oconee Humane Society is responsible for the adoption and spay/neuter programs.

Volunteer needs: Dog and/or cat socializers; community outreach participants including adoption events, free pet food pantry and vaccination clinics; adoption center administrative support, and fundraising team members.

Other needs: Cat litter and pate cat food for the kitties and medium/large harnesses and leashes for the dogs. Dry dog and cat kibble; sturdy dog and cat toys to help pets combat shelter stress and any office supplies such as copier paper, pocket folders and stamps.
